

# **Strategy Overview**

The NFJ Global Sustainability Wrap Strategy seeks attractive long-term competitive returns and to have a positive societal benefit by considering environmental, social, and corporate governance (ESG) criteria. A disciplined investment process is used to identify high-quality companies considered best-in-class in ESG practices and financial fundamentals.

# Strategy Highlights

- Sustainability and Robust Growth Potential Assessing the quality of a corporation's ESG practices can help identify information not reflected in its stock price and provide insights into how the company manages its business risk.
- ➤ Innovative Focus on Fundamentals A disciplined, fundamental research process that uses big data and data analytics to uncover differentiated insights into valuations quickly and efficiently helps identify companies with attractive quality characteristics, shareholder yield, and consistent financials.
- ESG Expertise Utilizing proprietary ESG scores, custom peer groups, and fundamental research to produce an ESG-driven portfolio of 40-60 stocks with attractive valuations and high-quality characteristics.

## **Market Overview**

Global equity markets rose across the board as softer inflation and resilient economic growth boosted investor hopes of lower interest rates and a soft economic landing. Europe ex-UK markets led for the quarter, followed by strength across North America. Conversely, the UK and Emerging Markets lagged on a relative basis. In the MSCI All Country World Index, technology rose 18%, followed by robust gains from real estate, industrials, financials, and materials. In contrast, energy, consumer staples, healthcare, and communication services posted the weakest returns for the quarter.

## Portfolio Overview

The NFJ Global Sustainability Value Wrap Strategy underperformed the MSCI All Country World benchmark Index. Negative stock selection and regional allocations drove performance results, while sector allocations contributed over the quarter.

## Portfolio Contributors

Stock selection was positive across the real estate and financials sectors. By region, selection was strongest across Europe. From a positioning standpoint, an underweight in the energy sector contributed and an overweight in Europe ex-Japan marginally benefitted results. Dassault Systèmes and Alexandria Real Estate Equities were the strongest absolute contributors.

Over the course of three decades, NFJ Investment Group's commitment to value has remained steadfast. Our investment process – built upon the principles of Benjamin Graham, the father of value investing – has stayed true to the philosophy of the firm's founders while continuing to evolve in the hands of their successors through the integration of new technological capabilities and advanced analytics methods that enhance the research process.

Dassault Systèmes provides software applications services designed to support client's innovation processes in mission-critical industries such as aerospace and automotive.

Management announced slightly better-than-expected 3Q results and largely reaffirmed FY2023 guidance on large deal strength and double-digit growth across major product segments.

High-quality office REIT Alexandria Real Estate Equities delivered solid 3Q results that beat the Street's estimates, and management raised adjusted funds from operations (AFFO) guidance on strong leasing trends. The company also increased the annual dividend by 5%. Alexandria Real Estate is ranked in the top 10% in ISS environmental and social scores and top 10% in S&P Global ESG scores (as of December 31, 2022), and was recognized by GRESB, a provider of standardized and validated ESG data to the capital markets, as a Regional and Global Sector Leader in the Science & Technology sector for outstanding ESG integration in the company's value-creation development projects.

## **Portfolio Detractors**

Stock selection was negative across the industrials and consumer discretionary sectors, as well as among Emerging Markets and North America-based names. From a positioning standpoint, overweight positions in healthcare and across the Emerging Markets detracted. Paycom Software and WuXi Biologics were the strongest absolute detractors from quarterly results.

Cloud-based human capital management solutions provider Paycom Software delivered disappointing 3Q results, as one of its new products showed signs of cannibalizing other digital services. We exited the position during the quarter.

China's WuXi Biologics provides R&D and manufacturing services that enable pharmaceutical, biotech, and medical device companies to advance discoveries and deliver groundbreaking treatments to patients. Management cut sales and profit guidance amid a global downturn in biotech funding and regulatory delays in project deliveries and shares traded downward. The company launched a \$600 million share repurchase program, and we trimmed the position during the quarter.

## Outlook

Uncertainty remains elevated as equity investors look to navigate 2024. First, geopolitical volatility continues on multiple fronts as the war in Ukraine approaches its third year, while the long-term impacts of conflict across Israel, Gaza, and the Middle East are unknown. With the invasion of Ukraine, one implication investors considered was a possible energy crisis. As the war has reached a stalemate, uncertainty has somewhat subsided, and oil and gas supplies continue to meet market demand. Now, conflict in the Middle East poses the latest threat to oil supply. However, the U.S. has become a more impactful oil producer, and the conflict has yet to disrupt production. Other investor impacts have included periodic risk-off moves for global equities, creating a cap on interest rates, as well as offering long-term support for defense sector names.

Another contributor to overseas investors' uncertainty is the implications of China's faltering economic reopening for its trade partners. At the start of 2023, stock pickers had high hopes for the reversal of lockdowns in China. Instead, consumer confidence sagged and China's housing market remained in a downturn. Even with these struggles, China's economic growth remains solid compared to global peers, and policymakers have many tools to stimulate business and consumer spending. Today, the MSCI China Index trades at a 32% discount to its ten-year median price-to-earnings ratio while the country's economic rebound continues at a choppy but upward trajectory.

After a year in which U.S. equities generally led international markets, the relative valuation discount on overseas stocks remains near all-time high levels. The S&P 500 Index trades at 22x forward earnings, while the MSCI ACWI is over 16x and the MSCI ACWI ex-U.S. is just under 13x. Emerging Markets are even more discounted, with the MSCI EM Index trading under 12x and the MSCI China at 9x forward earnings. While geopolitical conflicts can always pose increasing and/or unpredictable risks, we believe discounted companies that provide strong balance sheets, predictable earnings, and grow return of cash flow to shareholders offer positive prospects in 2024. Finally, we believe investing in companies with best-in-class ESG practices can help investors avoid certain tail risks in an increasingly unpredictable investment landscape.
