VMFIX: The fund class gross expense ratio is 0.83%. The net expense ratio is 0.74%, which reflects a contractual expense reimbursement in effect through 1/31/2025.

STIGX: The fund class gross expense ratio is 0.64%. The net expense ratio is 0.50%, which reflects a contractual expense reimbursement in effect through 4/30/2025.

SAMFX: The fund class gross expense ratio is 0.58%. The net expense ratio is 0.46%, which reflects a contractual expense reimbursement in effect through 4/30/2025.

INDEX DEFINITION: The Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index measures the U.S. investment grade fixed rate bond market. The index is calculated on a total return basis. The index is unmanaged, its returns do not reflect any fees, expenses, or sales charges, and is not available for direct investment.

Effective Duration: The change in the value of a fixed income security that will result from a 1% change in interest rates while taking into account the way changes in rates will affect the expected cash flows of any bond with an embedded option such as call or prepayment option. This measure assigns a probability to the exercise of a call option, where applicable, based on specified shifts in the yield curve. Duration is expressed as a number of years, and generally, the larger the duration, the greater the interest rate risk or reward for a portfolio's underlying bond prices.
